In the occasion of celebrating America's Independence Day, it is my honor to invite you to participate in a unique forum being organized within the context of *Asian American Empowerment objective*:

State of Virginia's first ever Annual Asian American Legislative Summit 2009

Who and What – You are cordially invited to attend this important forum because of your belief and interest in preserving the strength of us Asian American *Pacific Islanders as a dynamic and diverse people. Collectively we represent a precious gift to America, helping transforming this great nation.*

Purpose: To foster a sharing of ideas among Asian Americans, professionals, and entrepreneurs that will lead to craft concrete initiatives leading to a better quality of life for all Asian Americans. The purpose here is to 1. Identify and 2. Prioritize legislative issues that are most pressing to Asian Americans so collectively we can create an action plan to influence future executive and legislative government's decisions that are favorable to our communities.

Why Do We Do This?

This year's Asian Legislative Summit will be very timely. As Virginia will have a new governor, and the number of Asian American s continue to increase in the Commonwealth, **we will be meeting with the two (2) gubernatorial candidates and lawmakers from the General Assembly** as we will present to them about our concerns in the Fall, using the list of top priorities obtained from this August 5th Summit.

How Do We Do This?

This is three-prong project:

1. To do this, we will first start with having a **Legislative Summit** on August 5th which basically a free dinner focus group with the goal to conduct an in-depth assessment of the Asian American community issues facilitated by an Asian Attorney, Attorney Tony Pham, an Attorney with the City of Richmond and President Elect of the Asian American Pacific Bar Association of Virginia.
2. Then, in October, all Summit participants will be invited to return and gather for a free dinner program featuring a **Forum Discussion of our issues made to the two gubernatorial candidates** and Asian communities making briefings of our issues to **law makers at the General Assembly**.
3. These two events will conclude with a Free **State Legislators Recognition Dinner – Reception for all Asian Americans**.

Project Goal

Our goal for this forum is to be catalytic. This Summit is meant to foster the development of our most pressing concerns, and we hope to work with you to help bring these issues out to the legislators and the future executive branch.

Make Your Voice Heard

Participation is essential for the outcome of this meeting to be successful, and your participation in these creative, interactive, results-oriented, and productive meeting is needed!

Agenda/Program Details

An agenda for the working Summit is outlined below. The symposium focuses on concrete deliverables - a plan for follow-on actions. There is no cost involved. We also offer a light dinner / beverage for everyone.

1. *Registration- Meet and Greet* – 15 minutes

2. *Overview of how our ancestors' history began in America* (starting with the Chinese American in late-19th-century California- Restriction of immigration by the Chinese Exclusion Act of 1882 - Civil Rights Act of 1967). 15 minutes

2. *Identifying Asian American Issues: Facts – Issues – What Do You Think.* 30 minutes

3. *Prioritizing Asian Americans' Issues: Dialogue and Discussion.* 1 hour 30 minutes
